
- 1. This Order may be cited as the North Somerset District Council (Portbury Ponds) Public Space Protection Order 20XX.
- 2. This Order shall commence on the date it is made and cease to be of effect on the XXXX
- 3. This Order applies to the public spaces specified in Schedule 1 and imposes restrictions as set out in Schedule 2.
- 4. It is an offence for a person, without reasonable excuse:
 - (a) to do anything a person is prohibited from doing by schedule 2 of this order, or
 - (b) to fail to comply with a requirement to which the person is subject by schedule 2 of this order
- 5. A person guilty of an offence under condition (a) or (b) of article 4 of this order, is liable on summary conviction to a fine not exceeding level 3 on the standard scale or fixed penalty notice of a maximum £ 75.

Schedule 1

1. Land within the boundary of the Parish of Portbury falling within the following categories

- 1.1 All that land in the Parish of Portbury known as Portbury Ponds as shown on the attached plan
- 1.2. All that land in the Parish of Portbury known as the Ecology Park as shown on the attached plan



Schedule 2

Restrictions

- (1) No person shall take a dog onto, or permit a dog to enter, or allow a dog to remain on any land within the boundary of Portbury Ponds unless
 - (i) the person is registered as a blind person in a register compiled under Section 29 of the National Assistance Act 1948, or
 - (ii) the person is deaf, in respect of a dog trained by the Hearing Dogs for Deaf People and upon which he relies for assistance, or
 - (iii) the person has a disability which affects his mobility, manual dexterity, physical co-ordination or ability to lift, carry or otherwise move everyday objects in respect of a dog trained by a prescribed charity and upon which he relies for assistance, provided that the dog is on a lead.
